Decide if each statement is true or false. Be prepared to explain your reasoning.


- 9 + 4 = 9 + 1 + 3

13.1: What's the Difference?


A group of third grade students were asked, "What pets do you have?" Their responses are shown in the bar graph.

What do you notice? What do you wonder?






Their responses are also shown in this bar graph.
