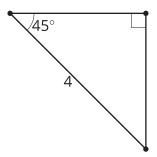
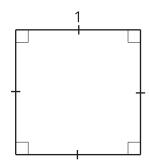


## **Lesson 2 Practice Problems**

- 2. What is the length of the diagonal?



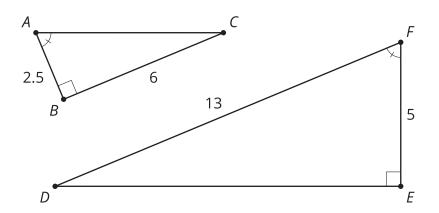
3. A square has a diagonal of length 5 cm. What is the area of the square?

  - b. Find the missing sides.



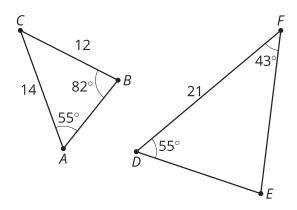
