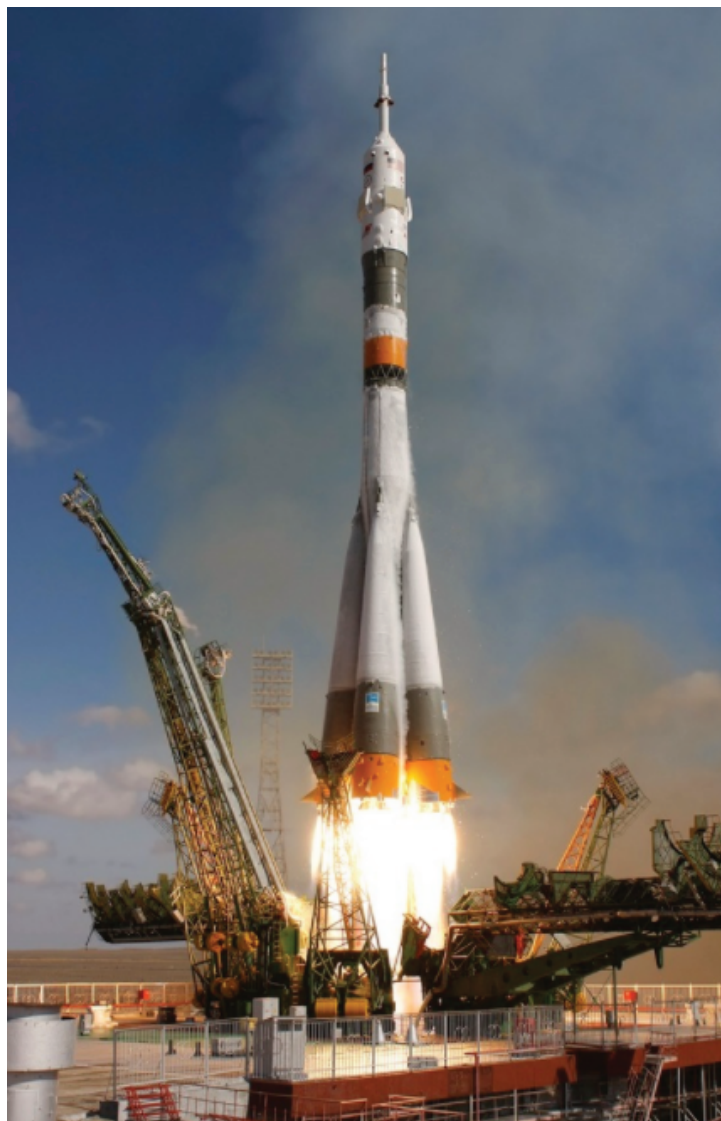


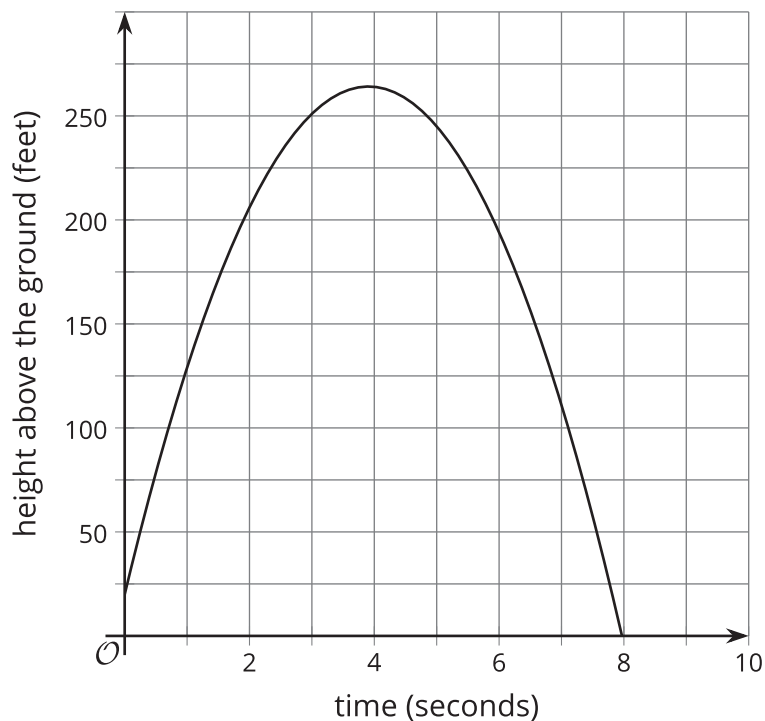
Lesson 1: Describing Graphs

What do you notice? What do you wonder?

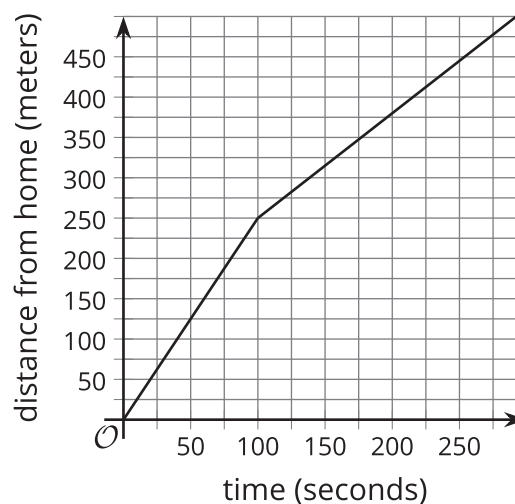
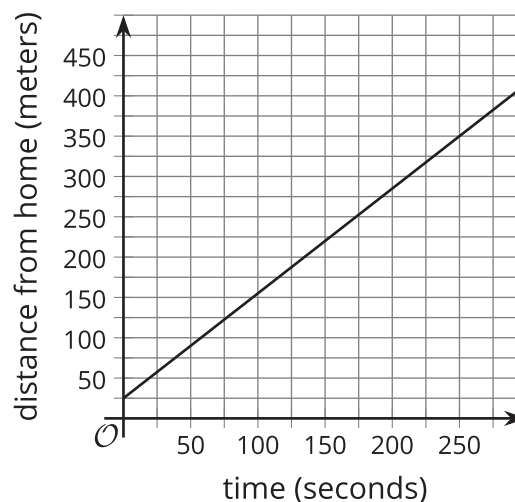
1.2: Matching Descriptions and Graphs

Match the graph to the description of the situation.

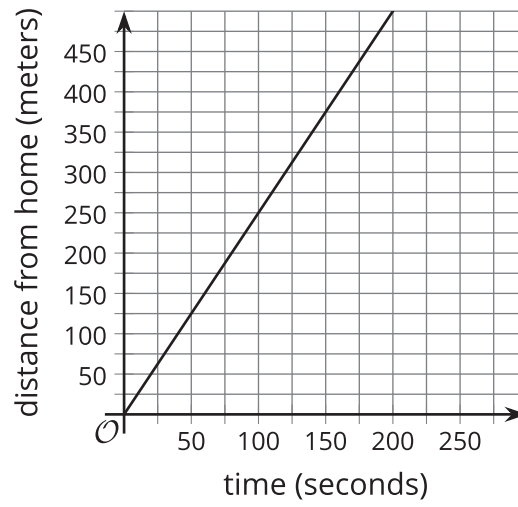
Match each description in column A with a graph from column B that represents the situation. Be prepared to explain your reasoning.

 - b. For each match that your partner finds, listen carefully to their explanation. If you disagree, discuss your thinking and work to reach an agreement.

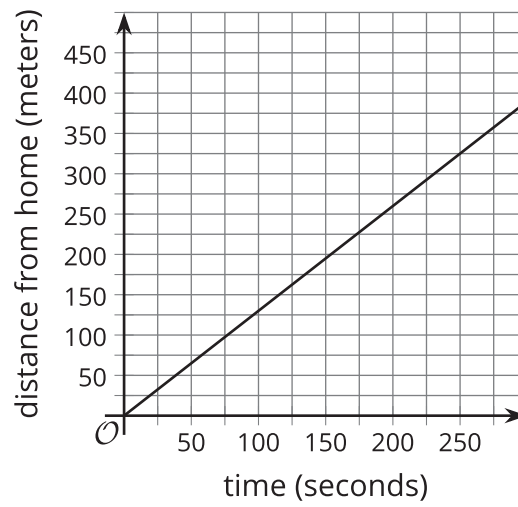
1. Mai begins at home and **A** walks away from her home at a constant rate.

6. Priya begins at home and runs away from home, then walks for a while.



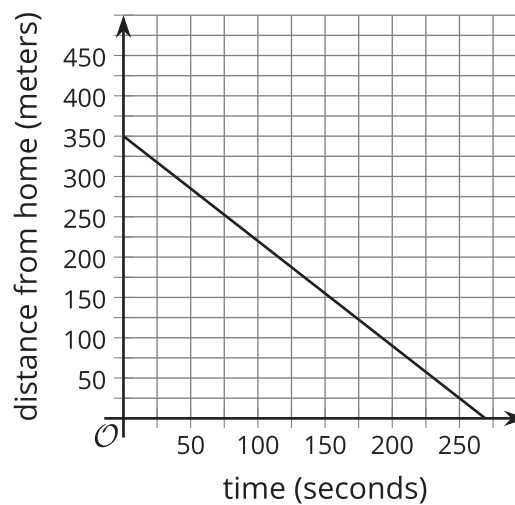
